

## Treasures from the National Museum: The Diba Hoard

The "Diba Hoard" is the name given to a remarkable collection of objects which is shedding new light on the egalitarian foundations of tribal society in Oman. Here, the National Museum's Director-General, Jamal al-Moosawi, and the Head of Curatorial Unit, Moza al-Wardi, tell us the story behind this fascinating discovery. The hoard itself consists of thousands of precious objects recently discovered at a collective grave site in Diba, on the eastern edge of the Musandam Peninsula. The corridor-like grave measured 14.75 metres in length and 3.5 metres in width, and contained the remains of at least 188 individuals. Found within and around the grave were bronze and soft-stone vessels, daggers, bracelets, beads, arrowheads and medallions dating from the Early Iron Age (circa 1,200–300 BCE).
